



## CBA Captain<sup>®</sup> (tested as CICA1521)

### Agzone 1 WA

April 2023, prepared by NSW DPI

- CBA Captain<sup>®</sup> is a broadly adapted desi chickpea variety with an erect plant type (like Genesis™836).
- CBA Captain<sup>®</sup> has a good height to lowest pod and good lodging resistance. These attributes combined provide excellent harvestability. Far superior to PBA Slasher<sup>®</sup> and PBA Striker<sup>®</sup>.
- CBA Captain<sup>®</sup> is mid flowering and early to mid-maturing in WA growing environments.
- CBA Captain<sup>®</sup> has been evaluated in WA NVT testing since 2017. CBA Captain<sup>®</sup> has consistent long-term yield gains over Genesis™836 and equal or higher yields than PBA Striker<sup>®</sup> in Agzone 1 (Table 1). #### Disease resistance

- CBA Captain<sup>®</sup> has an NVT pulse disease rating for Ascochyta blight of Moderately Susceptible (MS) in the northern region and Susceptible (S) in the southern region.
- In WA, Ascochyta Blight evaluation has been performed by the Centre for Crop and Disease Management (CCDM) Curtin University, where CBA Captain performed similarly to Genesis™090 with lower disease observed than for Genesis™836, PBA Striker and PBA Slasher.
- Each year, the CCDM program collects and tests Ascochyta samples from WA growing regions. A small proportion of fungal isolates collected from 2019 to 2022 have elevated levels of aggressiveness, but CBA Captain remains the most resistant variety tested.

- CBA Captain<sup>®</sup> has a disease rating for Botrytis grey mould of Susceptible (S), the same as all other current chickpea varieties.

### Grain quality

- CBA Captain<sup>®</sup> has a medium seed size with a yellow-brown seed coat and angular seed shape, similar to PBA HatTrick (widely grown desi in NNSW, QLD)
